### What Makes Rocketship Stand Out?

#### **Our Rotational Model**

Unlike most elementary schools where students are in one classroom with one teacher, Rocketeers rotate between Humanities, STEM, Learning Lab and Enrichment each day. This model allows us to improve student outcomes.

### **Personalized Learning**

We don't believe in one size fits all when it comes to learning. That's why we customize each student's education through small-group instruction, 1:1 support, online learning programs, and more. This helps students who need extra support catch up and those who are above grade level continue growing. This all starts by creating strong relationships with Rocketeers and their families.

- Every fall, educators visit students' homes to learn about their life outside the classroom
- Students have personalized growth goals mapped to their grade level
- Families get updates on student progress in weekly updates, at three parent-teacher conferences, and through our open-door policy with parents.

### **How Does Rocketship Serve Students with Special Needs?**

Unlike most schools, we operate a meaningful inclusion model, so students aren't separated from their classmates. Instead, they have daily access to our general education environment.

- Students with special needs spend 50-80% of their day in general education classrooms.
- Students experience the same instructional program as their typically developing peers
- Students receive small group co-teaching and individual instruction

### Nuestro modelo de rotación



### **Community Meetings/ Events**

# Family and Community Engagement Goals

### **HOME VISIT**

Teachers and leaders visit the home of every student we serve to learn more about their family, life, and experiences outside of school. By changing the dynamic from parent in a teacher's classroom, to teacher in a parent's house we are able to develop much deeper ties with our parents that carries through the school year and beyond.

### **Parent Teacher Conferences**

Family Teacher Conferences occur three times per year and are another way to share key academic data with families. School is closed on these days to ensure sufficient time to meet with each family. Teachers come prepared with a completed report card, student work, and any other relevant assessment and/or classwork data to share with the parent. The goal is to help parents understand the Rocketeer's data and also to ensure they walk away with the strategies and support they need to supplement the child's education at home. 100% of families must have a Family Teacher Conference each round.



# Family and Community Engagement Goals

### **Principal Coffee**

Parent Coffees occur once a month and are a formalized venue for conversation between families and the Principal. These can be used as an opportunity to provide feedback on critical systems like arrival, dismissal, lunch, and recess, they can be used to share data and skill build with families, or they can be used for any other topics that the Principal and families deem necessary to discuss. Parent Coffees are interactive, solutions-oriented, and rely on open and honest communication amongst all stakeholders. They are regularly scheduled and families know about them at least 3-4 weeks in advance.

### Los Dichos

Once a month, our Rocketship families are invited to come into the school for an hour and forty-five minutes each session to train, read a book, and do a hands-on activity. While in the classroom, families will read and lead an activity in partnership with their child's teacher.

### Dismissal cards must be checked



- \* During dismissal, nobody can pick up a child without the appropriate dismissal card or app -- no exceptions
- \* If the pick-up person does not have the dismissal card, they must show their ID <u>and</u> be on the student's approved pick-up list
- \* Anyone picking up a student must be 18+ years old.
  - \* Exceptions can be made for teenage relatives -- but families need to fill out our official form in advance
