

DICTIONARY ENTRIES

Dictionaries are reference texts that help us understand words by giving us a **dictionary entry**. When you open a dictionary, the words in **bold** are called **entry words**.



Dictionary entries tell us:

- The word (eg: volcano)
- How to pronounce the word (eg: väl kā nō)
- The part of speech of the word (eg: noun)
- Many definitions of the word

Sometimes dictionaries also show us an example of a sentence with the word in it.

When we use dictionaries to learn the meaning of a word, we must:

- Look at the context of the word in the sentence and ask:
 - "What part of speech is the word being used at?"
 - "What do we think it might mean?"
- Look at all the definitions of the word in the dictionary
- Ask ourselves, "Which definition matches best?"

GUIDE WORDS

are words at the **top** of a dictionary. These words tell you the **first** and **last entry** on the page. By looking at the guide words, you can tell which words will appear on that page.
