Financial Assistance

Update:

Wednesday morning, the Senate passed a \$2 trillion relief plan to help families during the COVID-19 crisis. The bill will give eligible families a one time payment of up to \$1200 depending on a variety of factors. Factors include income, marital status, children etc. For example, if you are single you must make less than \$75,000 and if married you must make less than \$150,000 to receive full payments. Payments will also include an additional \$500 for children under the age of 17. Families will not need to apply to receive these payments as the Government will mail checks or deposit directly into bank accounts, depending on your tax return information. Housing

<u>Santa Clara County Board of Supervisors</u> Adopts Urgency Ordinance No. NS-9.287 established a temporary moratorium on evictions resulting from the Novel Coronavirus (COVID-19) Emergency within Santa Clara County and declared urgency thereof, to take effect immediately.

The purpose of this Urgency Ordinance establishing a temporary moratorium on tenant evictions is to effectuate the Governor's Executive Order in Santa Clara County by providing stability during the COVID-19 pandemic, preventing avoidable homelessness, and maintaining the public health. The temporary moratorium on residential and commercial tenant evictions will protect the health, safety, and welfare of the residents of Santa Clara County.

The Urgency Ordinance will provide protections to tenants throughout Santa Clara County, including in cities by using the emergency authority granted by the Governor, as well as Government Code section 8634. However, where a city in the county enacts an ordinance or regulation that is more protective of tenants, the city ordinance or regulation will apply. The Urgency Ordinance will expire on May 31, 2020 unless shortened or extended by the Board of Supervisors based on the continued existence of a local emergency.





San Jose Mayor Liccardo and City Council approved on March 17, 2020 an <u>urgency ordinance</u> enacted by <u>Council resolution</u> a 30-day moratorium to prevent families from being evicted from their homes during this public health crisis.

- The temporary moratorium does not exempt renters from paying rent, but halts evictions of tenants who have lost jobs or wages and are unable to pay rent as a result of COVID-19. What is it?

The Homelessness Prevention System (HPS) program provides temporary financial assistance (e.g. rent, deposit, or utilities payment) to low-income families or individuals who are struggling to maintain their housing.



Who is eligible to receive HPS assistance?

HPS is available to low-income (80% of Area Median Income) households in Santa Clara County who are at imminent risk of losing their housing. A pre-screening interview and questionnaire are used to determine eligibility.

How can I find out if I qualify? Visit any participating agency for pre-screening. Hours and times vary and some agencies require an appointment, so it is strongly recommended that you call before going in. The first step includes an interview and questionnaire, and will take anywhere from 1-3 hours to complete. If you meet initial eligibility requirements, you will be asked to come back and meet with an agency representative to complete the application.

What should I bring to my first visit?

Different agencies have slightly different requirements. However, it may be helpful to have ID's for all household members, lease agreement, income documentation for the past 2 months, and recent bills. It is strongly recommended that you call before your first visit.

What if I don't qualify for the HPS?

Some agencies may have additional resources available to offer emergency services to households at risk of homelessness. An agency representative will guide you to any other resources that may be available and helpful in your situation.
