


# Student Achievement Update: Spring testing is in progress

### Early Preview: NWEA MAP Growth Years

- Although only CA and NSH have started NWEA MAP, ~40% of students have tested in each subject are currently and we are starting to
- Math growth is currently on-track to be lower than pre-pandemic rates and slightly below last year's rate
- Reading is on-track to achieve similar growth rates to prior years

### Fall-to-Spring Avg Growth Years









# CA Upper Grades currently have the highest completion rate (80-89%)

## Common Core Adoption

Rocketship pilots two CCSS aligned curricula (Envision and Singapore Math) but sees no significant difference in student results from strongest teachers who are writing their own lessons.

2014 - 2018

## Curriculum Development

Strong Rocketship teachers identified & developed as "Common Planners" to create plans for their network grade level. Added CGI Number Stories & Counting Collections to math block. 2018 - 2020

## COVID Gaps & Elevating Impact


