

Public Release for the Community Eligibility Provision

Rocketship Public Schools is participating in a Free Breakfast and Lunch program for the current school year 2026-27. This alternative is referred to as the Community Eligibility Provision. All students enrolled at the following school may participate in the School Breakfast Program and the National School Lunch Program at no charge. Household applications are not required to receive free meals, but applications may be distributed by the school to collect household income data for other programs that require this information. All students will be served breakfast and lunch at no charge at Rocketship Mateo Sheedy, Rocketship Si Se Puede, Rocketship Los Sueños, Rocketship Mosaic Elementary, Rocketship Discovery Prep, Rocketship Brilliant Minds, Rocketship Alma Academy, Rocketship Spark Academy, Rocketship Fuerza Academy, Rocketship Rising Stars, Rocketship Redwood City, Rocketship Futuro Academy, and Rocketship Delta Prep.
